What and Why?

When you register to vote, your name will appear on the electoral register. If you are worried that this might not be safe, you can apply to register to vote anonymously.

To make this kind of application, you will either need a court order - or a signed document from someone like a GP, a director of adult or children's services, or a police officer of inspector rank or above.

If you are registered to vote anonymously, you don't need to show photo ID when voting, but you will need an anonymous elector document, which your local authority will give you once you are registered.

How?

Applications must be made on paper. You can scan the QR code to be taken to the Government website where you can print the papers at home, or you can request them from your local electoral registration office.
